

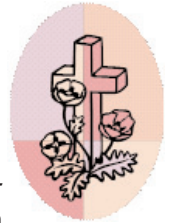

June 14th was Flag Day, and members of Post 41 marked the occasion with appropriate ceremonies. We had in mind the American Legion Chaplain's prayer, an appropriate text with which to mark the significance of this uniquely American occasion.

O God, we thank you for the flag of our Country and for all that our Flag represents. We thank You for giving the victory to brave and valiant men who have given their last measure of strength in order that it might wave over the land of the free and the home of the brave. We thank You for giving us the ideals of faith, and liberty, for preserving the sanctity of our homes, and freedom of worship. Conscious of our limitations and our deep unworthiness, we pray that our Flag may bind together the many elements in our own dear country and foster in our ranks a one hundred per cent Americanism. Make us who have served our country in time of war willing at all times to uphold and defend our Constitution and our government. 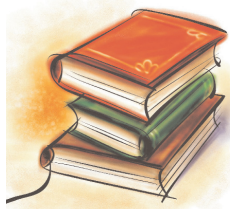

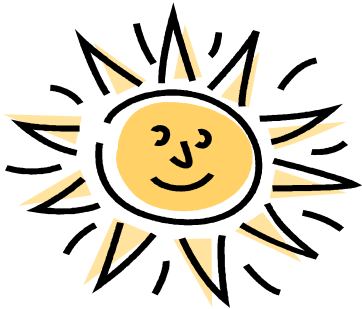
